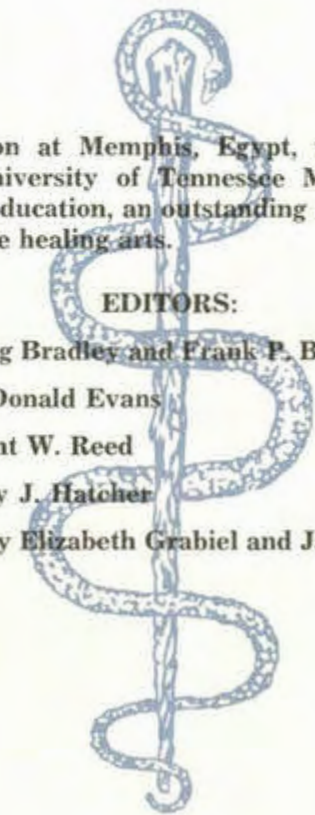

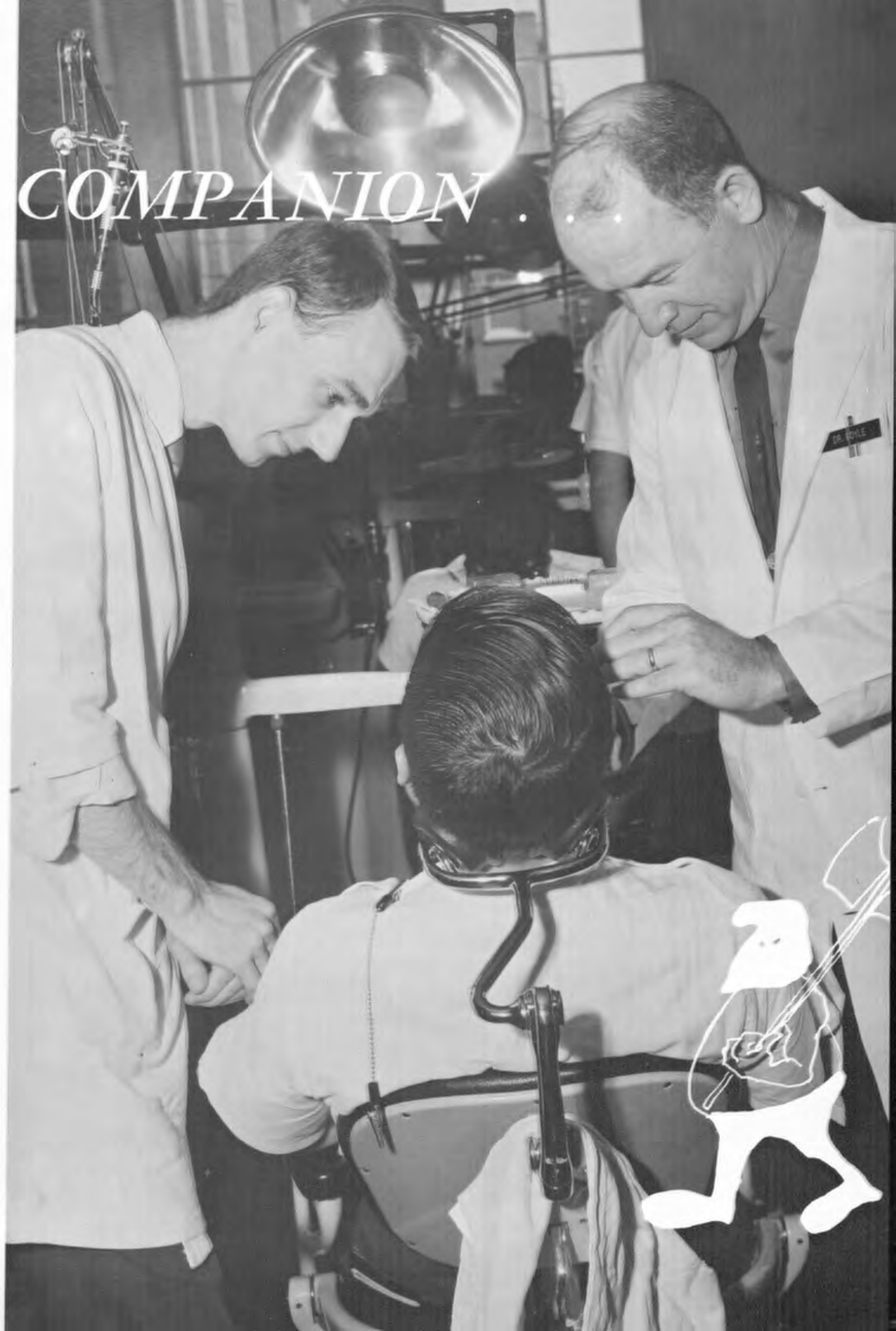

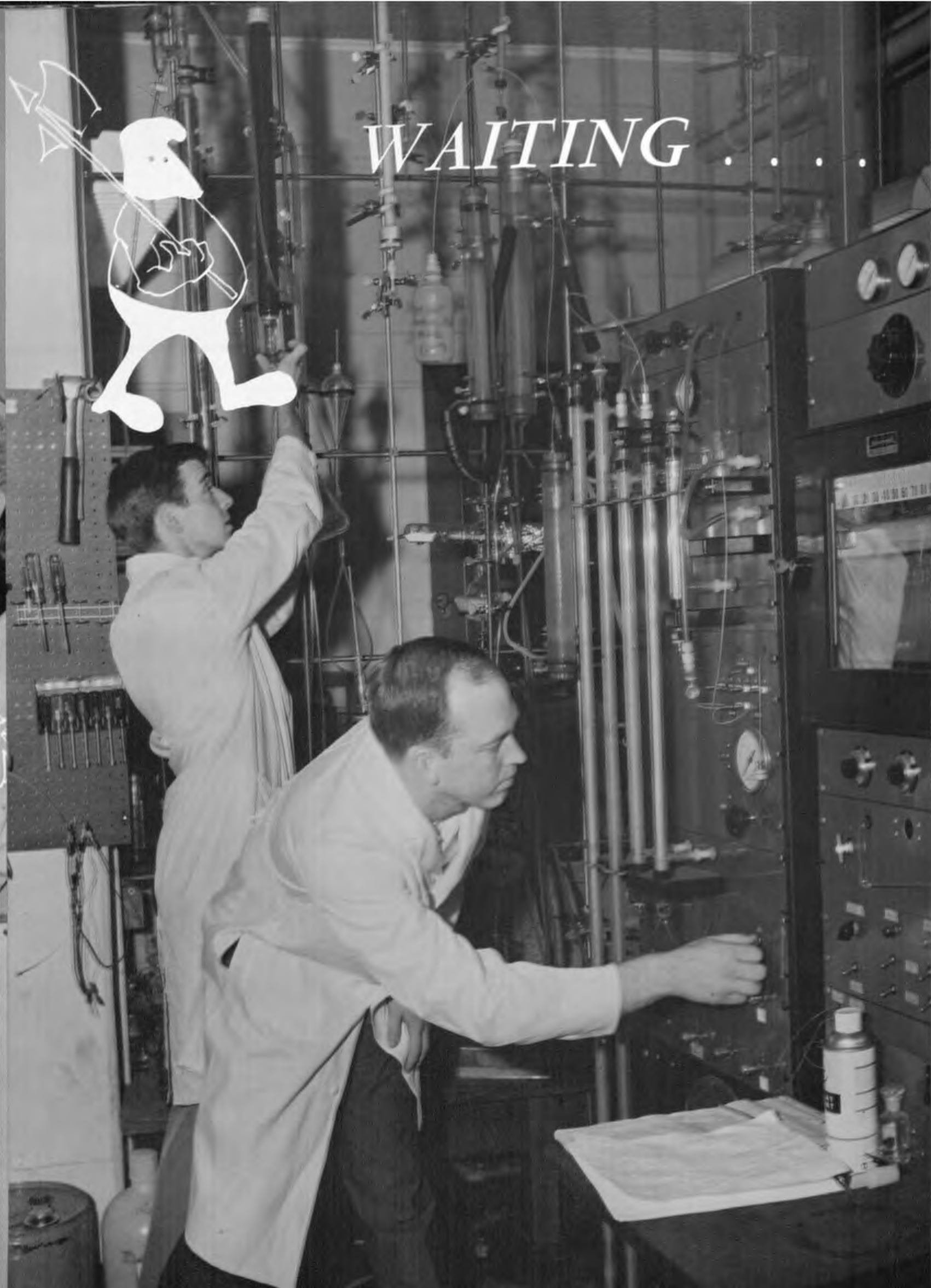

## CHANCELLOR AND ADMINISTRATION

Continuing progress of our Society depends upon the further development of new knowledge. For centuries, our universities have been the fountainheads of new knowledge and they will remain as such for other centuries. The past few years have found Society making unprecedented demands on our institutions.

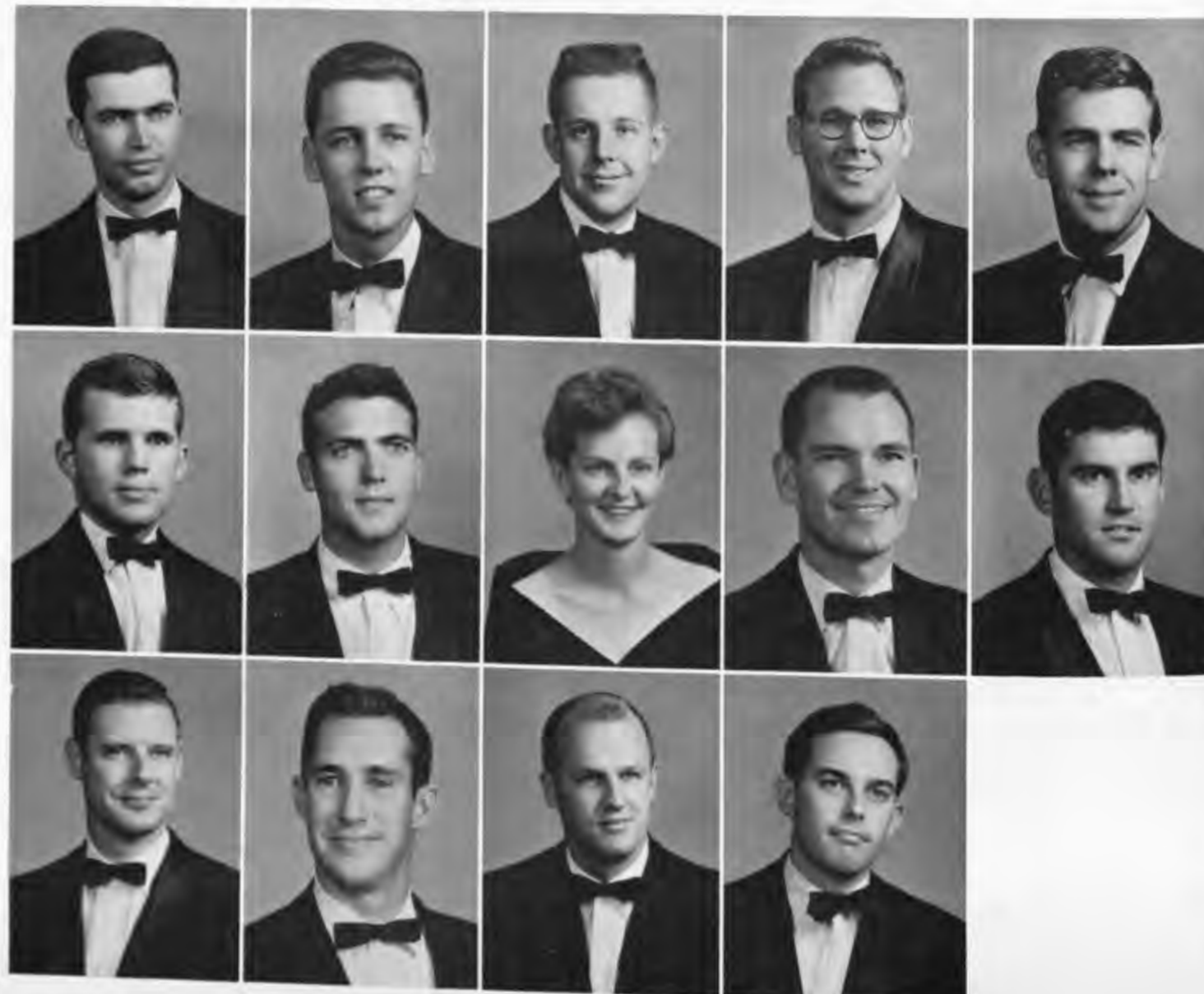

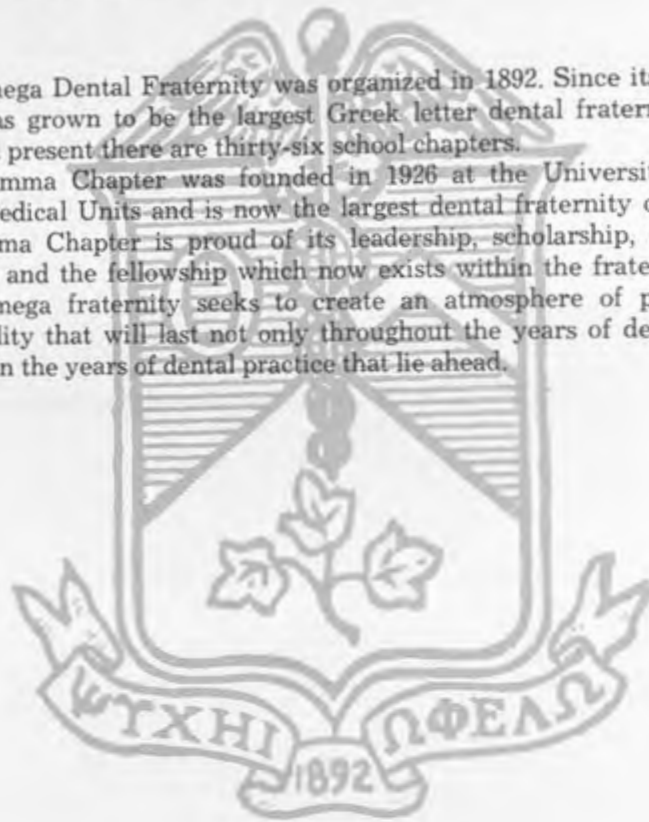


# PSI OMEGA

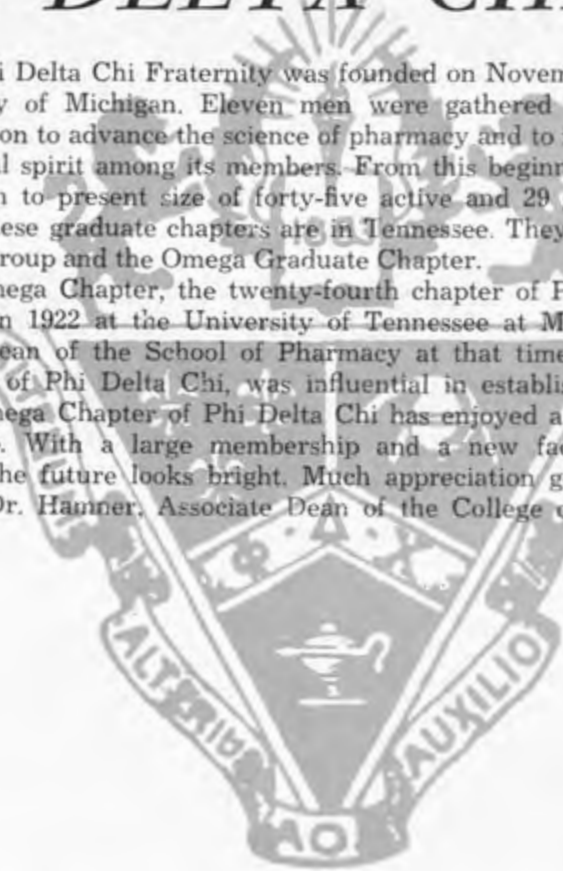


# PHI DELTA CHI

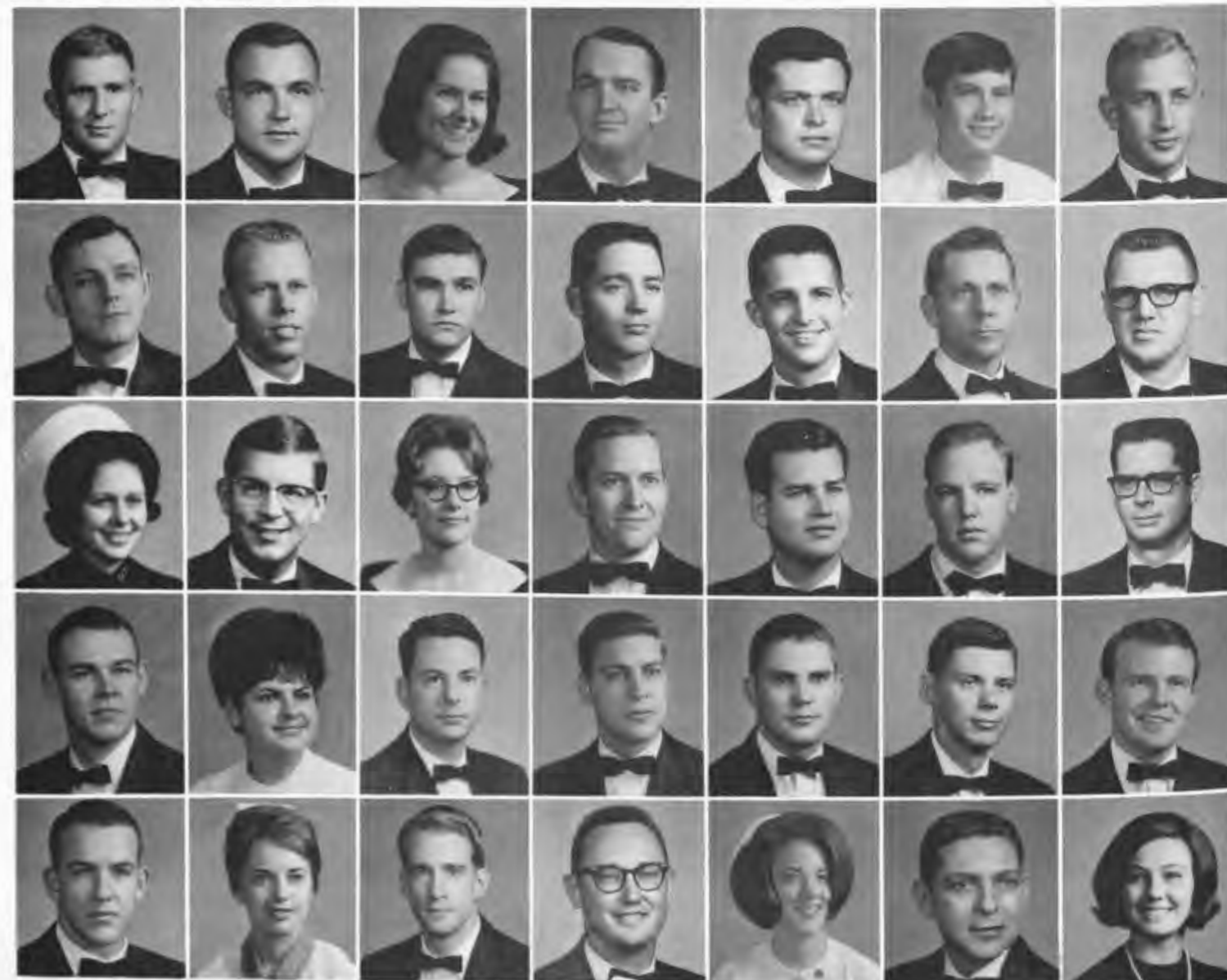
# STUDENT COUNCIL

"All Aboard for 'ALL SING!'—U.T.'s Martin Branch featured the Caduceus Chorus in that annual event held on the UTMB Campus.



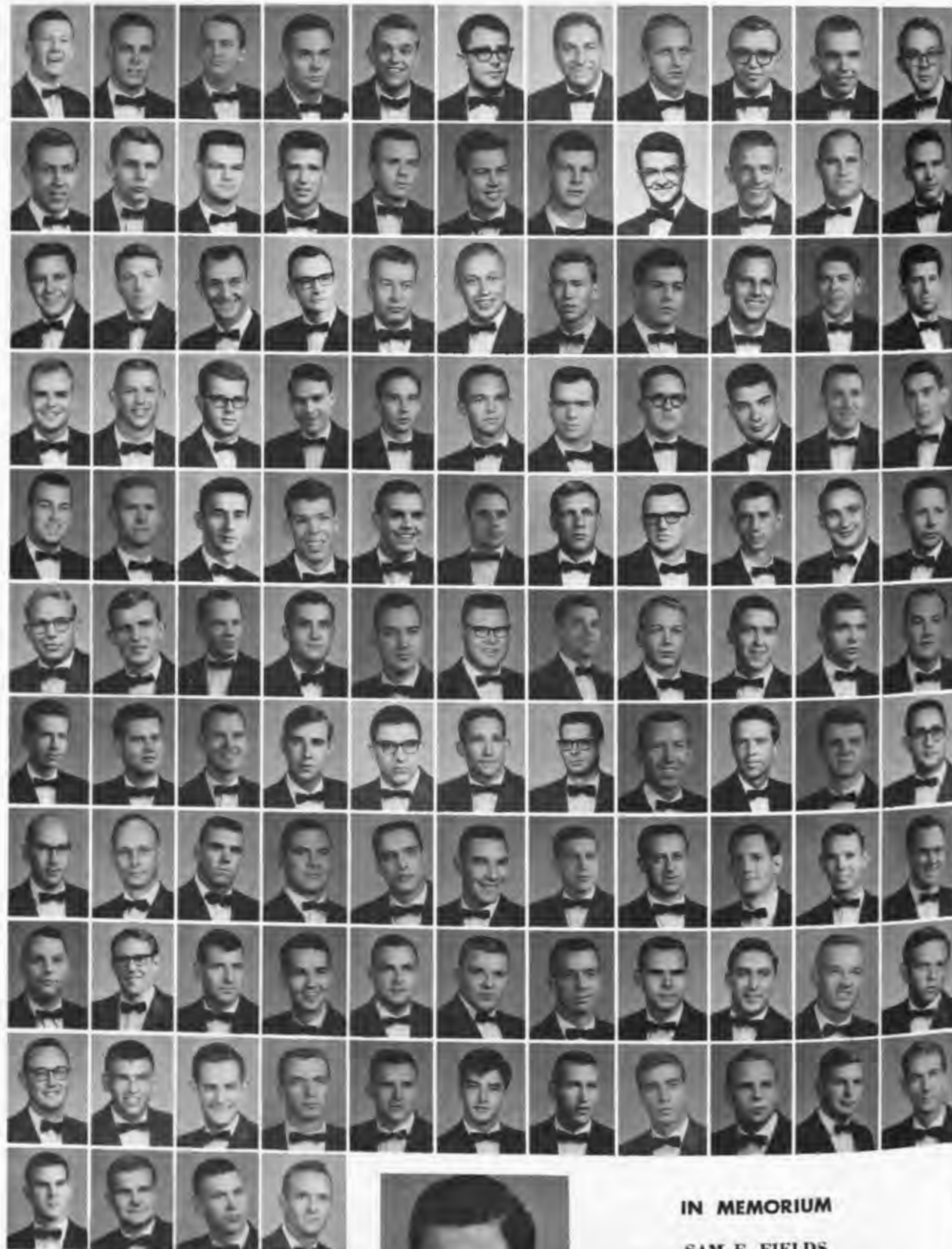
# NUX CLUB

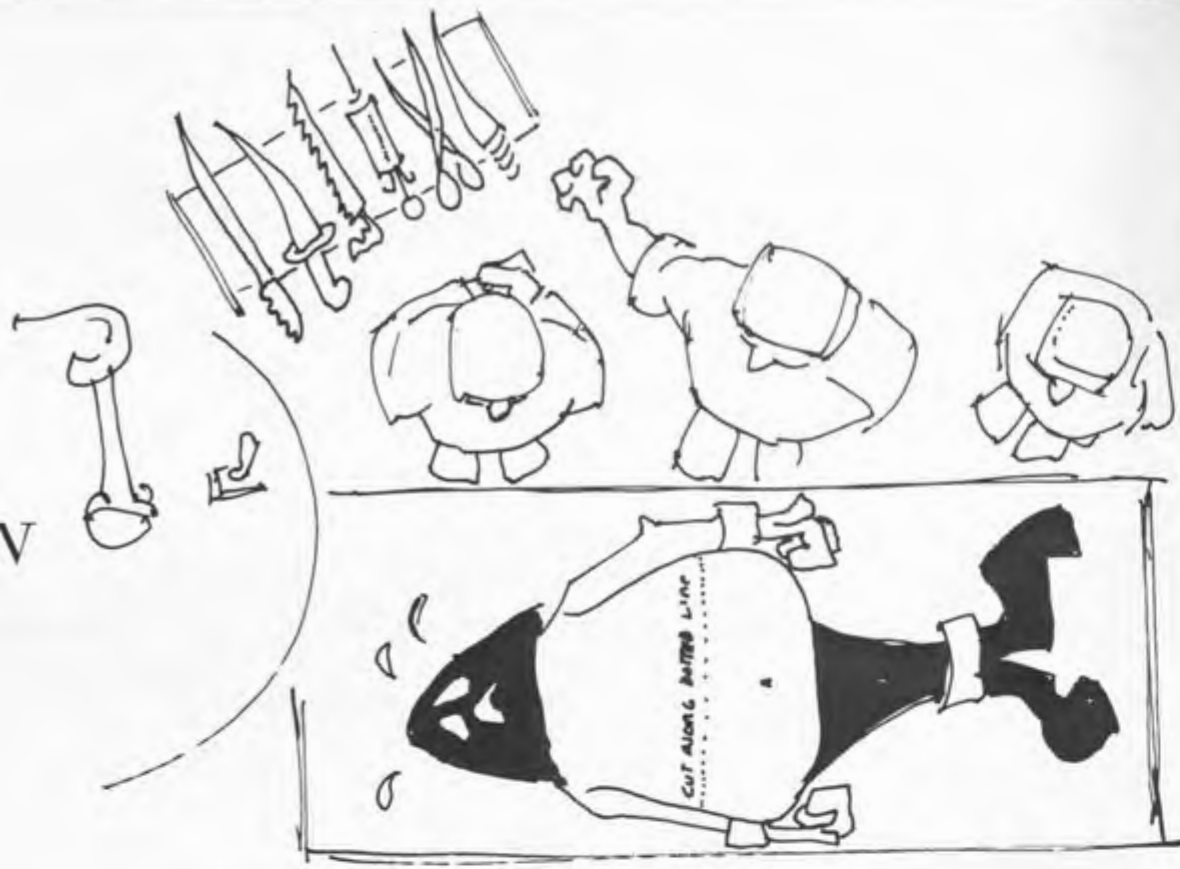
