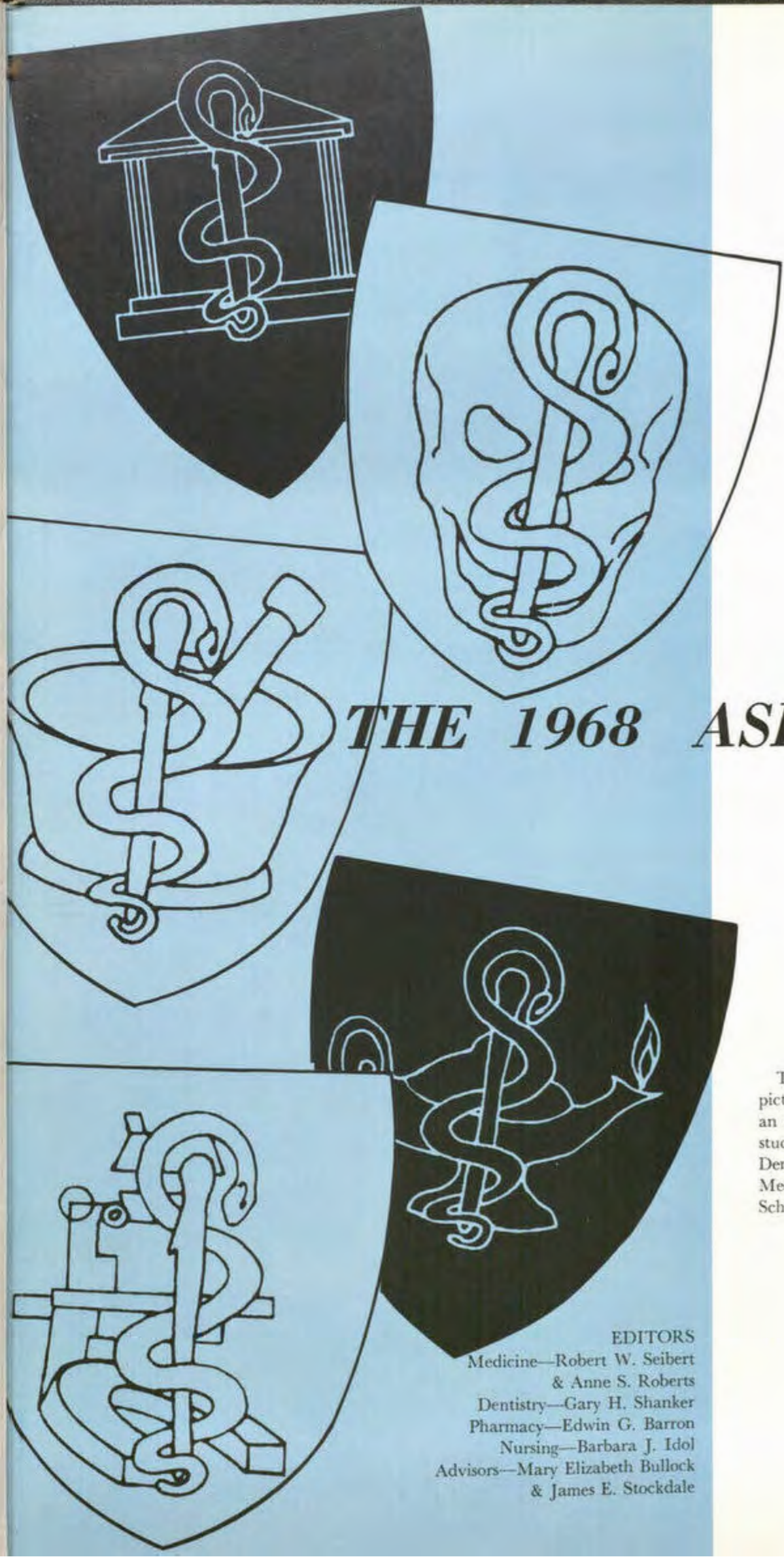

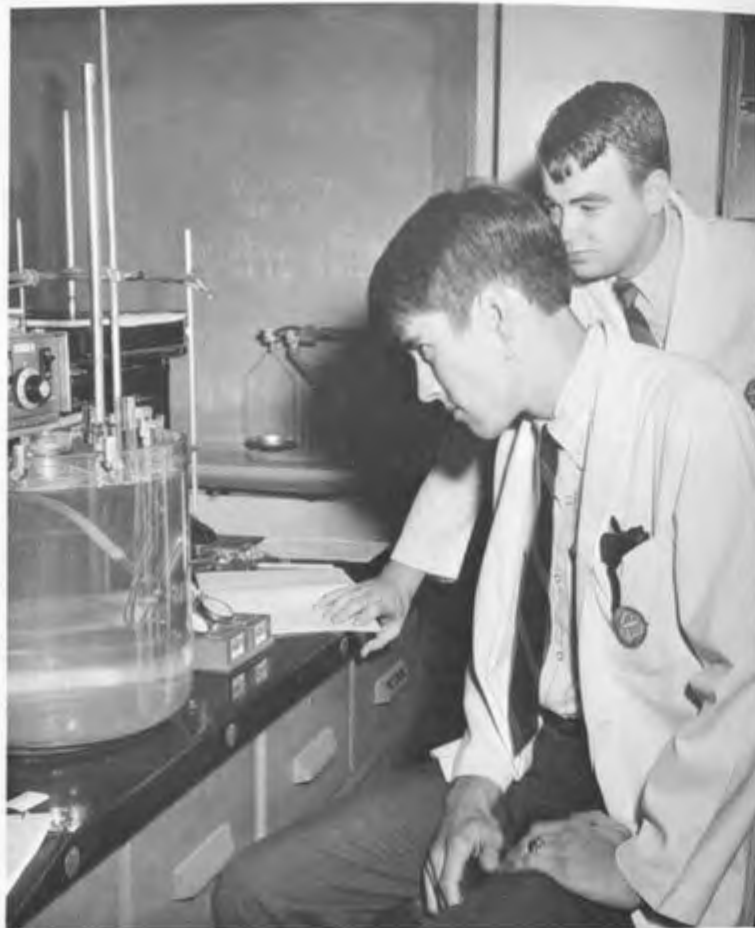
THE 1968 ASKLEPIEION

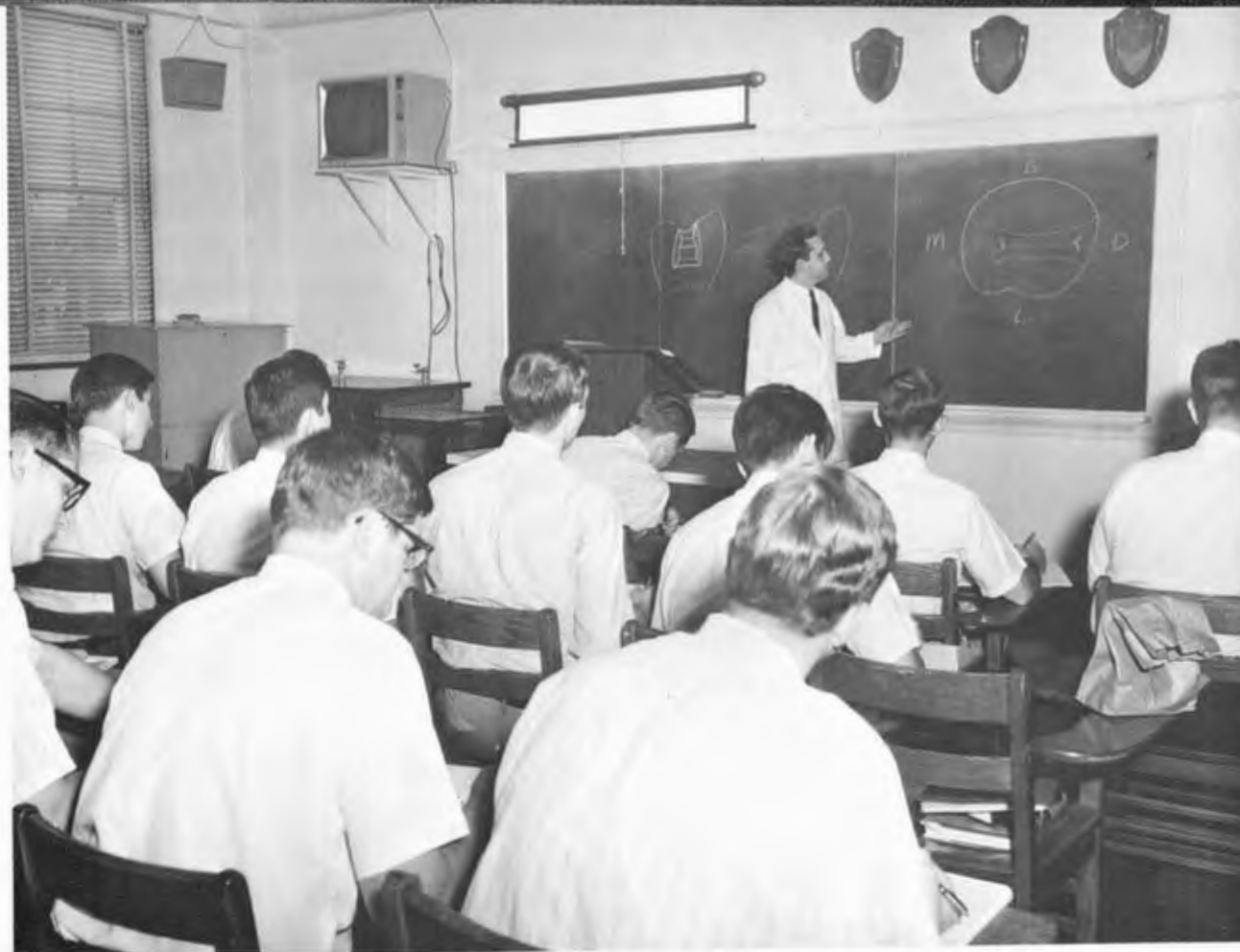


THE UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE MEDICAL UNITS, MEMPHIS



The beginning years at the Medical Units are primarily concerned with learning the theories to be used as a basis for decisions relating to the health and welfare of the patient. This basic knowledge is gained through long hours of study in the library and work in the labs.

As students progress through their training the actual professional skills are learned and some degree of proficiency is acquired. For most, this period of time includes an introduction to the patient-oriented phase of training.





The learning from books and classes is now supplemented by the patient as a valuable source of information. Now, more and more time is spent in patient-related activities as hospitals and clinics become the center of learning.





As the end of this phase of professional training is approached, more coordination of activities is instituted to achieve the goal of an integrated health team working for the welfare of the patient.

A passing grade dishonestly obtained robs a person of the honor and integrity that is prerequisite to the practice of Medicine.

The society was organized in 1914 at Northwestern University Dental School.

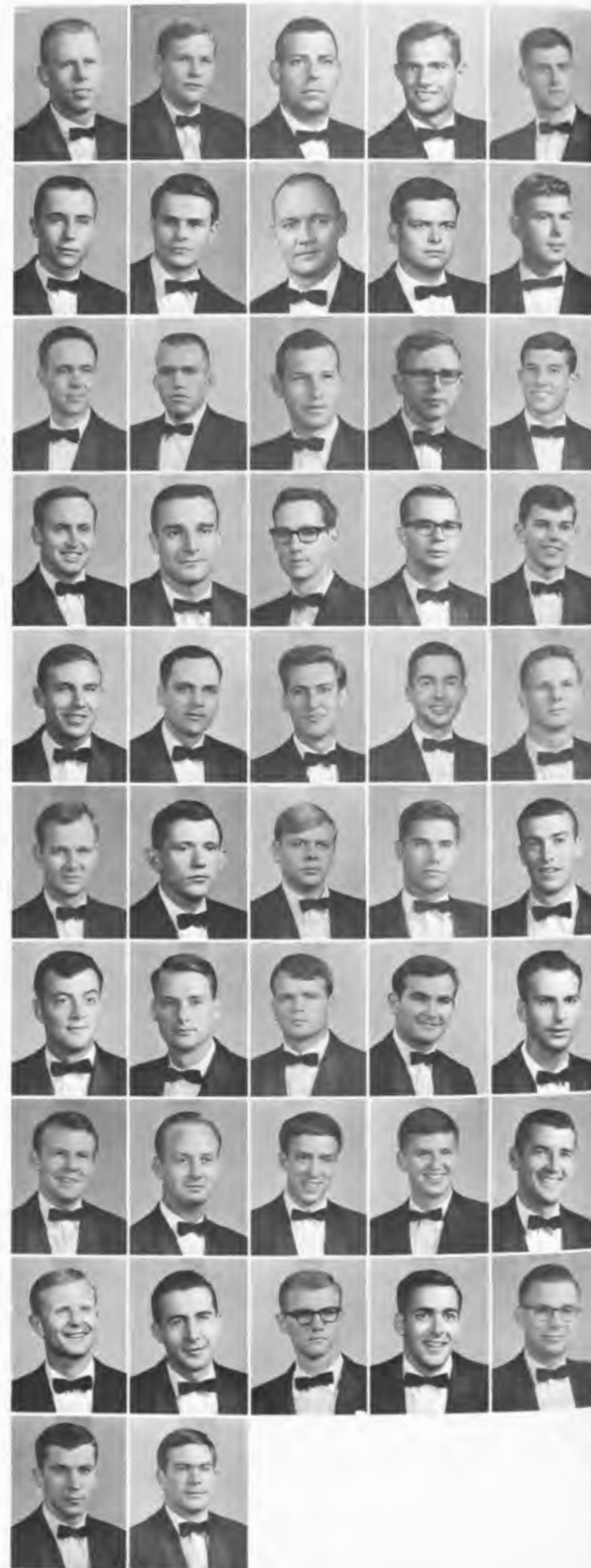

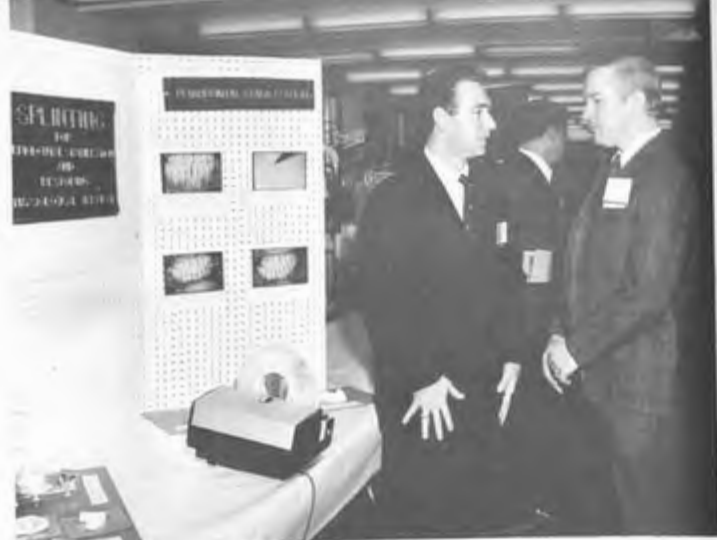

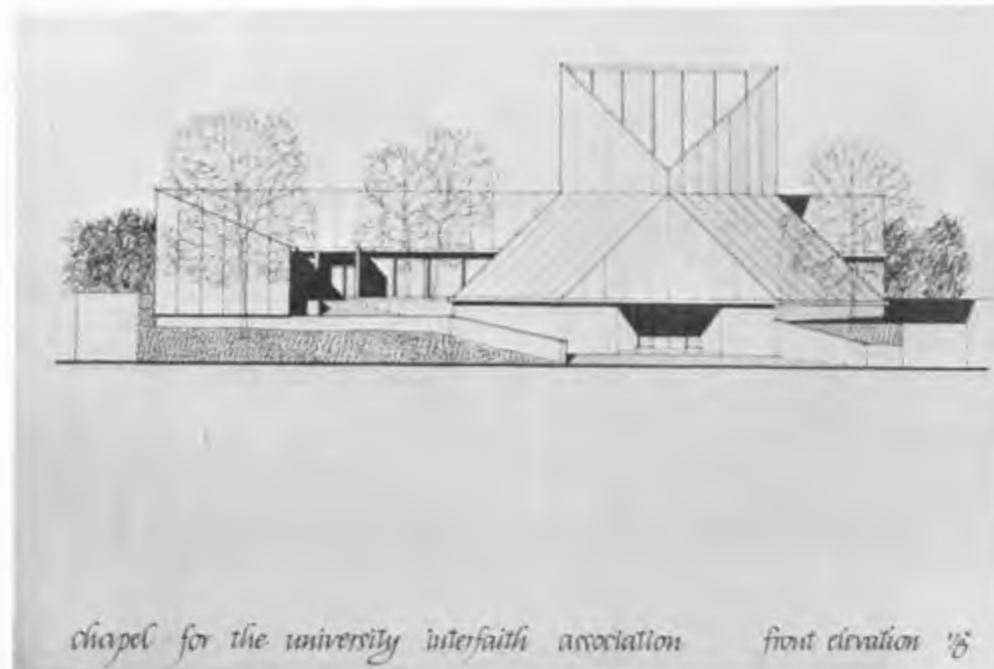

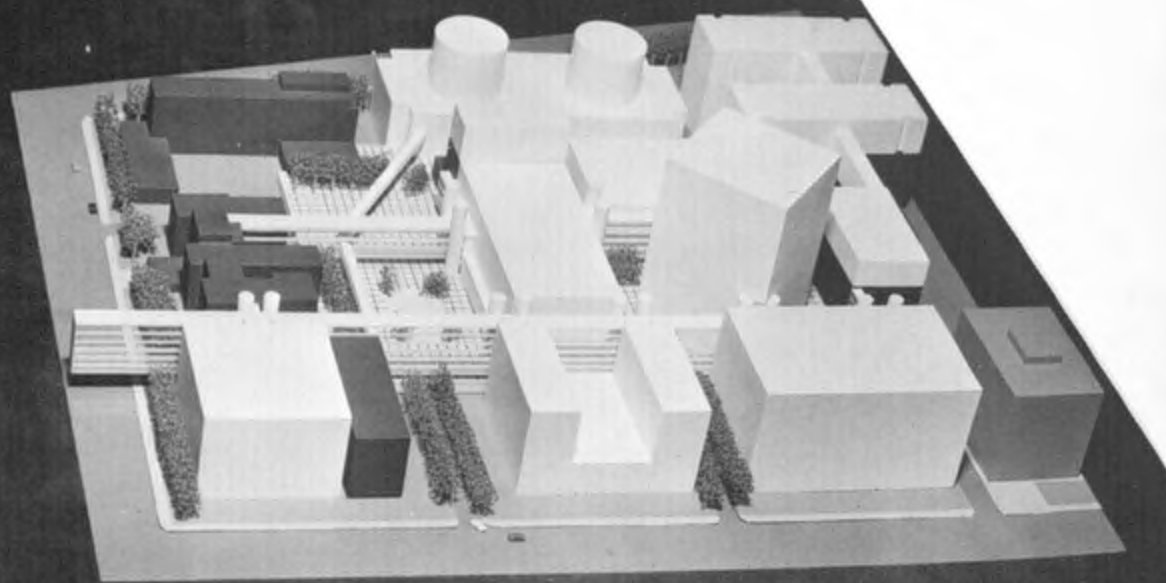
