
Uncle Joe, the head of our Memphis family, is always an alert guest at banquets.

That's bologna and cheese sandwiches for lunch, cold soup for supper and a litle girl who always gets sick on the wrong day.


Student life is so much and yet so difficult to capture. Our family album now is only beginning and there is more to come—preserved for perpetual observation.


General: This Medical student has known allergies to formaldehyde, pathology sections, and all cafeteria style cooking. Other intolerances include uncooperative nurses and warm beer.


Cardiovascular:

In addition to being subjected to malignant "hyper-tension", this student is known to have attacks of paroxysmal atrial tachycardia at the sight of Dr. Stollerman.


















GI and GU:


Neurological:

Dysmetria, bilateral Babinski, and positive Romberg tests are present on Saturday nights. Cremasteric reflex present only when performed by student nurse.




















Social and Family History:





tell stories of family history.















The Graduate College is an integral part of the Medical Units. Although small in enrollment, it plays a very important function since it is the source of the academician and medical scientist of the future.
