Academic Program Overview

The mission of the Pathologists' Assistant program is to prepare and develop individuals for the professional practice of surgical and autopsy pathology in a continually evolving health care environment under the guidance of a board-certified pathologist.

Description:

- Two-year program:
 - Year 1 didactic
 - Year 2 clinical
- 76 total credit hours
- Total Tuition:
 - Instate = \$56,058
 - Out of state = \$68.562

Unique Features:

- First program in Tennessee and only one in the mid-South
- Low student-to-faculty ratios
- Excellent local clinical rotation sites for students, including the WTRFC

Academic Program Overview

The joint BSN program is congruent with the missions of both institutions.

Description

- Four semester traditional program with two-year pre-professional courses completed prior to admission
- 60 credit hours professional program and 60 credit hours pre-professional requirements
- Concept-based UTHSC curriculum will be adopted
- Current UTS BSN will be taught out for all students in the program
- Prepares students to successfully pass the National Council Licensure Examination-RN (NCLEX-RN)

Unique Features

- Joint program offered in Memphis and Pulaski with projected start in fall 2023
- Allows students to remain in Pulaski after completing the first 2 years of coursework at UTS
- Includes a mixture of face-to-face didactic, on-site clinical, lab, remote synchronous, and remote asynchronous formats
- Enhances workforce in underserved and rural communities
- Maintains excellent local clinical rotation sites for students in south central TN

- Increases the number of post-secondary degrees in TN by expanding a successful baccalaureate nursing program
- Joint program will help meet the deficit of individuals trained to work in the field of nursing in the state
