Federal Exit Loan Counseling

The timely repayment of your student loans is important to maintaining a good credit history, especially if you wish to consider applying for future consumer or student loans. Therefore, it is important to know who owns your loan, when your payments are due, how to make a payment, and your total amount of indebtedness. Federal regulations require that all students who have borrowed from the federal loan programs receive exit loan counseling. **Exit loan counseling** provides details regarding a borrower's rights and responsibilities for student loan repayment, deferment options, and loan consolidation benefits.

If you are scheduled to graduate on December 11, 2015, have ACCEPTED Federal Student Loans, and applied the funds toward the cost of tuition, <u>you are required to have exit loan counseling before you graduate</u>. You can complete exit counseling online at www.studentloans.gov.

REPAYE Repayment Plan

MORE student loan borrowers are expected to gain access this year to a repayment plan that cuts monthly debt payments to a small share of their income. The plan has been called Repaye, for "revised pay as you earn." As the name suggests, it is based on the "pay as you earn" repayment program, which became available to some student loan borrowers nearly three years ago.

Monthly loan payments for participants in the repayment program will be capped at **10 percent of their discretionary income**. Any loan balance remaining after 20 years of payments will be forgiven, if the students have only undergraduate loans. **If they borrowed money for graduate school, the forgiveness comes after 25 years.**

You can apply online at <u>studentloans.gov</u> for the plan that offers the lowest payment for which you are eligible.
