Barbershops have been considered ideal settings for community-based interventions related to sexual health promotion, particularly with young African American males. Studies have indicated the interest and willingness of barbers to engage in sexual health promotion with their clients, but limited data exist on factors that may impede or promote the implementation of a sexual health promotion community-based intervention from the barbers' perspectives. After implementation of a 3-month community-based intervention in a predominately African American barbershop in Memphis, TN, we sought to understand barriers and facilitators of this intervention from the perspective of the barbers.
- 2. Kumar, S., Walker, C., Likes, W., Risley, C., & Robinson, W. The role of extracellular vesicles in HPV induced HIV pathogenesis. The University of Tennessee Health Science Center CORNET (Collaborative Research Network) Award, \$65,000, 01/21-12/23 (Co-Principal Investigator). The purpose of this study is to examine the effects of HPV on HIV pathogenesis and the role of natural compounds/antioxidant and chemodietary agents on suppressing HIV replication. The case-control study is being conducted over two sites (The University of Tennessee Health Science Center and the University of Mississippi Medical Center) in which a pilot of 40 participants (20 African Americans and 20 Caucasians with an equal representation of males and females) are currently being enrolled.

3. Walker, C., Williams, L. A., & Bowdre, T. Insights about antiretroviral adherence from the perspective of community health workers. UTHSC Dean's Fellowship Award, \$3,000, 01/21-01/22 (Principal Investigator). Many studies have focused on different ways to improve adherence to ART, but one method of particular interest is the use of community health workers (CHWs) as they continue to gain national recognition for their ability to improve healthcare outcomes. They have access to patients outside of the patient-clinician relationship in the typical clinic setting, and as a result, their insights about barriers to medication adherence and interventions to address non-adherence may differ from perspectives that are commonly cited in the literature. Acknowledging their insights will add to the current body of literature and will serve as a method of strengthening efforts to improve ART adherence and reduce the rate of new HIV infections. The purpose of this study was to understand barriers to ART adherence from the unique perspective of CHWs who work on the frontline in HIV care and to identify potential interventions to address poor ART adherence among people living with HIV.

Historically, Black individuals have been underrepresented in pharmaceutical clinical trials; yet, clinical guidelines are still created based on underrepresentation and limited findings of this patient population. Ledipasvir and Sofosbuvir (LDV-SOF) was approved in 2014 by the FDA as an eight-week therapy for the Hepatitis C virus (HCV). However, current guidelines recommend 12 weeks of treatment for all patients co-infected with HIV, although there are limited findings about Black participants in the LDV-SOF clinical trials. Therefore, the question of interest is if Black patients who are co-infected with HIV and those who meet the FDA's criteria for eight weeks of treatment can actually be treated for eight weeks instead of 12 weeks. The purpose of the study, therefore, was to identify Black co-infected patients who completed 12 weeks of treatment with LDV-SOF and to assess their HCV RNA over the course of treatment to determine if viral suppression occurred earlier at eight weeks.

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) grant is called Student Training and Education through Partnerships with Underserved Populations for Health Equity and Lifestyle Promotion (STEP UP and HELP), and it focuses on outreach through the use of a mobile health unit to counties in West Tennessee designated by HRSA as underserved communities. The primary goal of the grant is to provide care such as HIV care including PrEP and treatment, psychiatric mental healthcare, and women's healthcare to populations with limited healthcare access.
- 3. **Walker, C.,** Armstrong, D., Summers, N., & Cernasev, A. Interdisciplinary PrEP Bootcamp for Healthcare Professional Learners. Tennessee Department of Health, \$129,800, 2023-2025 (Principal Investigator). Clinicians play a critical role in identifying patients at risk for HIV and prescribing/managing Pre-exposure prophylaxis for HIV (PrEP), but many do not feel adequately trained to do so. As a result, we conducted PrEP bootcamp/training for healthcare professional students located at The University of Tennessee Health Science Center in Memphis, TN that

included patient-provider communication, epistemic injustice, and social determinants of health. The bootcamp included traditional didactic lectures, small group discussions, and simulation with standardized patients. Pre and post-surveys were used to identify changes in knowledge, comfort, attitudes, and awareness related to PrEP and focus groups were used for a more in-depth understanding of the bootcamp's impact and opportunities for improvement.
