Information compiled by the TN Dept. of Health, Office of Policy, Planning, and Assessment – Office of Minority Health ; the TN Dept. of Mental Health and Development Disabilities; and the TN Minority Health Community Development Corp. The report explores a wide ranges of diseases and health problems affecting people of color, examining and comparing the health status of minority populations with that of the majority population. This is a comprehensive presentation of health, socioeconomic, mental health and psychological issues, and behaviors as these factors interact with physical and emotional well-being of people of color.
