Maria Sun, RD, MS, Assistant Professor Southwest Community College Is Featured Speaker at September Retirees Luncheon

Maria Sun received her BS in Food Science at Clemson University in South Carolina and her MS from the University of Memphis.

Her professional affiliations include Memphis Area Nutrition Council, Memphis Academy of Nutrition Dietetics, TN Academy of Nutrition Dietetics and the Academy of Nutrition Dietetics.

Area(s) of Specialty are Nutrition and Wellness, Geriatric Nutrition and Intellectual Disability Nutrition.

Ms. Sun is an Assistant Professor, Southwest Community College Allied Health/Dietetics; Adjunct Faculty, Allied Health, Baptist College Health Science and a Consultant-Therapist for D and S Community Services.

Ms. Sun was one of four dietitians who worked with the UT Look AHEAD study, a NIH–funded multi-center research study with 20 sites across the U.S.

Maria's parents were both physicians and she always loved science, biology and medical care. She loves working with people and treating them with respect and dignity; encouraging, equipping and educating them with knowledge and tools so that they may use them to improve their health and bringing hope and improved health to those in need.

Highlights from June Retirees Luncheon

County Commissioner Melvin Burgess spoke of the many challenges and changes facing the Shelby County Schools.

These include:

- Inventory- some of the equipment, which can date back 40 years is difficult to find and account for it so one has to move on and there is now a plan in place for proper accountability for the tax-payers' money.
- The Merger of City and County Schools
- Budget has been approved-\$1,500,000. Shelby County Schools are the second largest employer in this county (FedEx being #1).
- Employee Benefits-People are living longer and working longer, but Mr. Burgess tries not to make recommendations to get rid of people, does not believe in messing with people's pensions and does not believe in outsourcing-Keep the jobs here.
- Getting the best teachers available, but the child is faced with hurdles at home
- Shelby County Budget More money is put into the correctional system than into the school system
- Education is most important, and all children should have equal opportunity
- As leaders, we have to help get the children living in the inner city beyond its borders Shelby Farms has worked with Mr. Burgess to get them out there to visit
- One of the questions asked when a new business considers moving here, "what about the work force?" Many are not trained to be able to do what is needed.
- Poverty is the major factor in the problem for all of the children getting an education. Some
 children want to go to school, but do not clothes, so they steal to get the money to buy them.
 Churches and outreach programs try to assist, but it will take the whole community to become
 involved to see results.
- Trying to revitalize the districts, to improve the schools, so we can have good schools all over the county.
- Everyone can help, even if it is only one child. Engage them, read to them, listen to them, care about them.
- The need to deal with the poverty rate and thus education are paramount so that this county may prosper.
