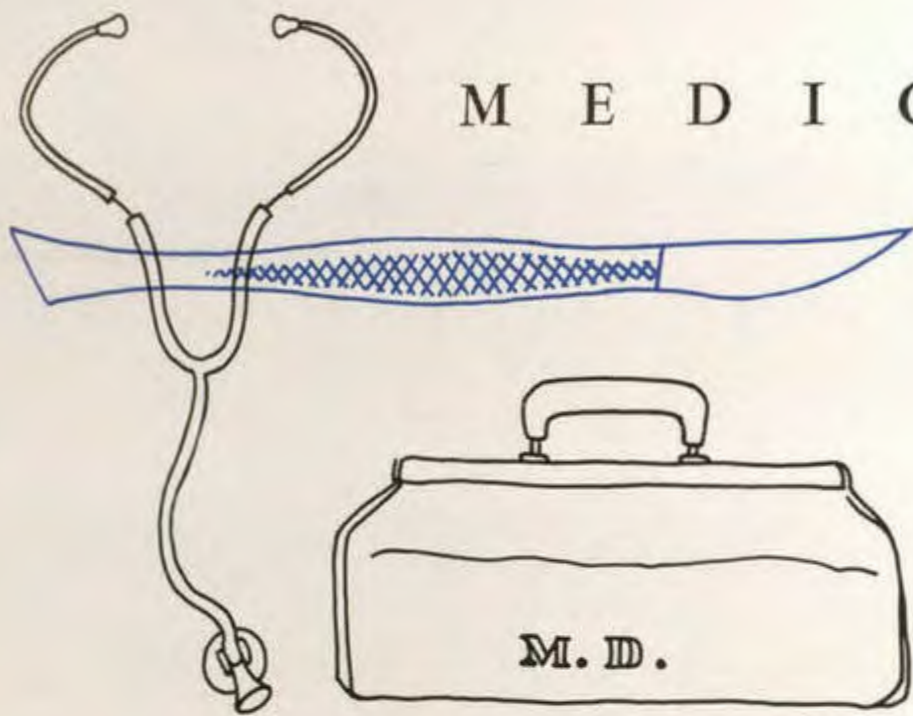

M E D I C I N E

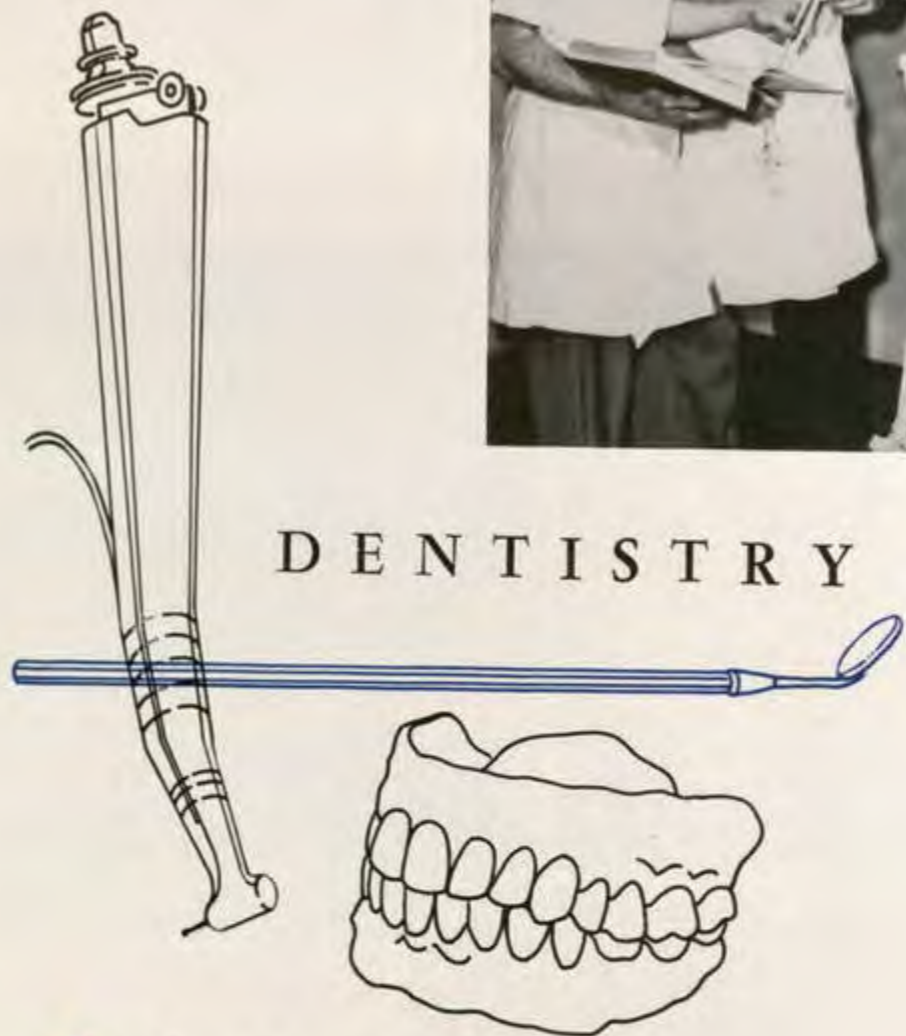


The University of Tennessee was established in Knoxville in 1794 as Blount College. The Medical Department of the University was founded in Nashville in 1876. This department was transferred from Nashville to Memphis by the Board of Trustees in 1911. Previously the University of Nashville Medical School (founded in 1850) united with the University in 1909. The College of Physicians and Surgeons with their school of Pharmacy (both founded in 1906) joined the University upon its moving to Memphis. In 1914, the Medical Department of Lincoln Memorial University (founded in Knoxville in 1899) was discontinued and its students transferred to the University of Tennessee.

In 1913, the Memphis City Hospital became the teaching center of the University of Tennessee and in 1920, it became a University Hospital when the College of Medicine accepted the responsibility of professional care of the patients.

Today, the University of Tennessee Medical School is the largest in the United States.





DENTISTRY

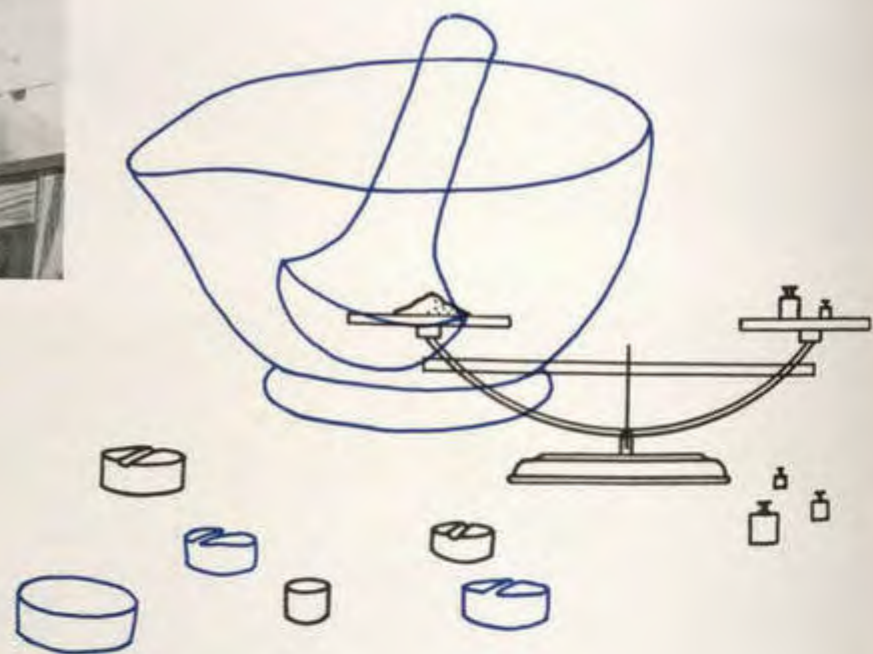
■ The College of Dentistry was organized and put into operation in the City of Nashville in the year 1878. The school was located on Market Street near the Public Square.

After the close of the first session, the dental college was taken into the State University and made the dental department of the University of Tennessee.

In 1883 the school moved to larger quarters on Broad Street. Continued growth, however, necessitated further moves and finally, in order to secure still larger facilities for the clinical work, the school was moved to Memphis in 1911, to a location formerly occupied by the Y.M.C.A. at 177 Union Avenue. In 1915 it was moved to 718 Union Avenue, Rogers Hall; and in 1949 it was moved to its present location at 847 Monroe Avenue.

The original faculty was composed of eleven members, headed by Robert Russell, Dean and Professor of Operative Dentistry. Eight men have served as dean of the Dental College since Dr. Russell and prior to Dr. James T. Ginn, the present dean, who was installed in 1950 and has been serving since that date.





P H A R M A C Y

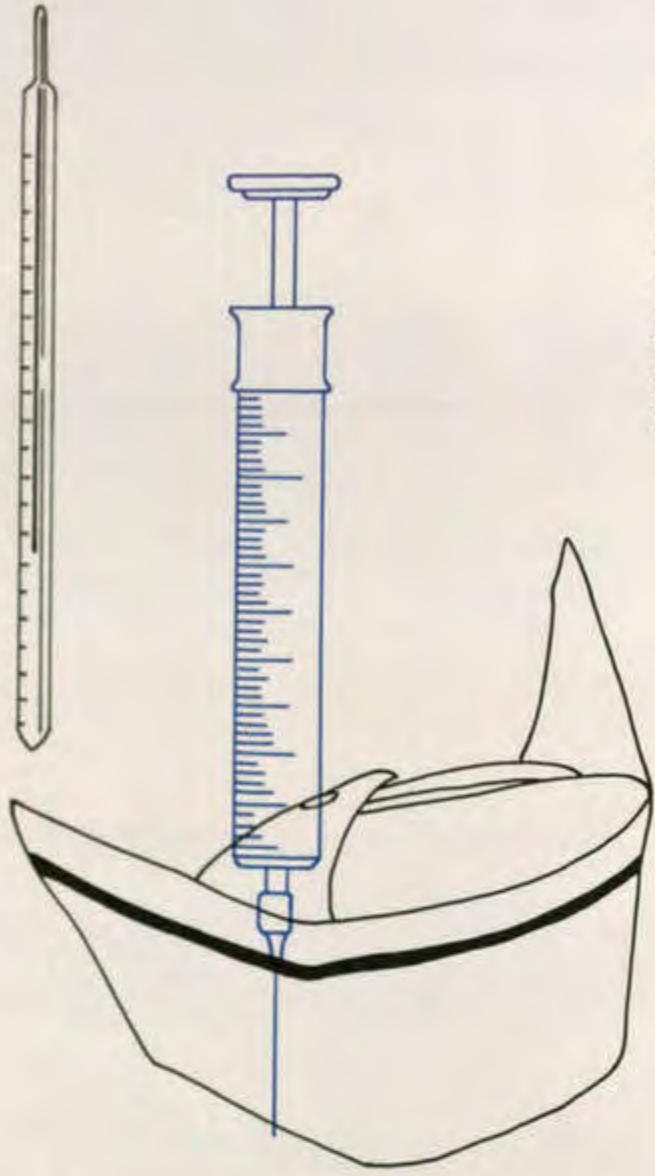
■ The School of Pharmacy was organized in 1898 at Knoxville as a part of the Chemistry Department. In 1909 the Medical Department of the University was consolidated with the Medical Department of the University of Nashville and the School of Pharmacy was moved from Knoxville to Nashville where it was operated as a Department of Pharmacy under the Medical Department. In 1911 the Board of Trustees of the University removed the Nashville Medical College to Memphis where it was consolidated with the College of Physicians and Surgeons, at which time the School of Pharmacy was operated by them. In 1911 and 1912, all pharmaceutical equipment was moved to Memphis and the Pharmacy School was then operated as a separate school from the medical college.

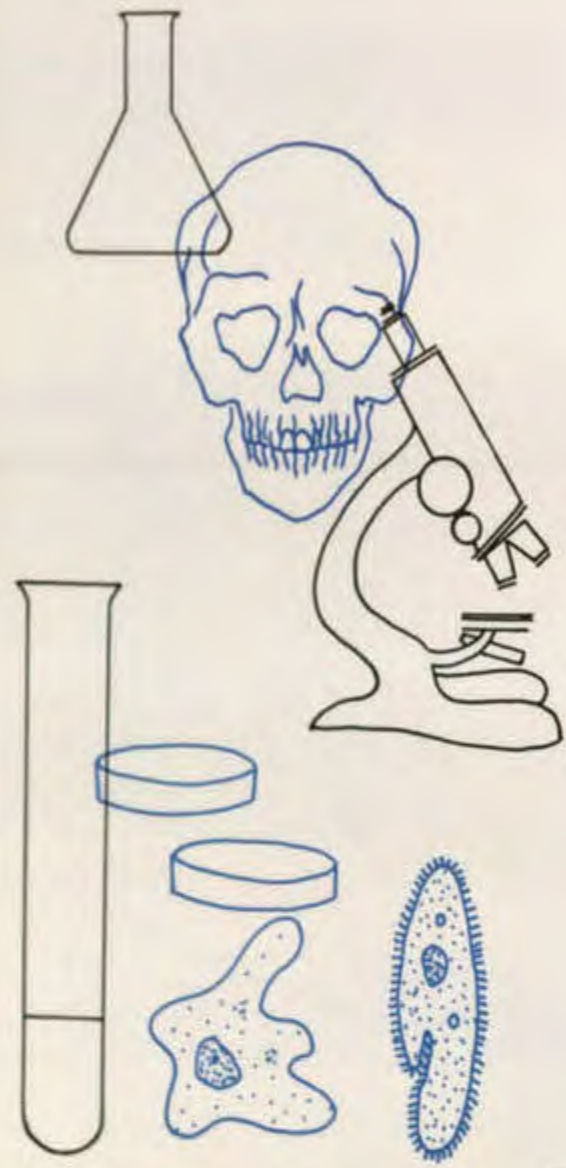
In 1914 the School was recognized by the New York Board of Regents, and in 1924, it was recognized by the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy and upon personal inspection became a full member. The School is accredited by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education.



N U R S I N G

■ The University of Tennessee School of Nursing was established in 1898 as the Memphis General Hospital School of Nursing. In 1926 the University of Tennessee School of Nursing came into being through a contractual arrangement between the University and the Memphis General Hospital. The School became an autonomous unit within the University in 1949 and the program leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing was established in September 1950. The School of Nursing is approved by the Tennessee Board of Nursing. Graduates may be admitted to the examinations for license to practice as registered nurses, (R.N.).





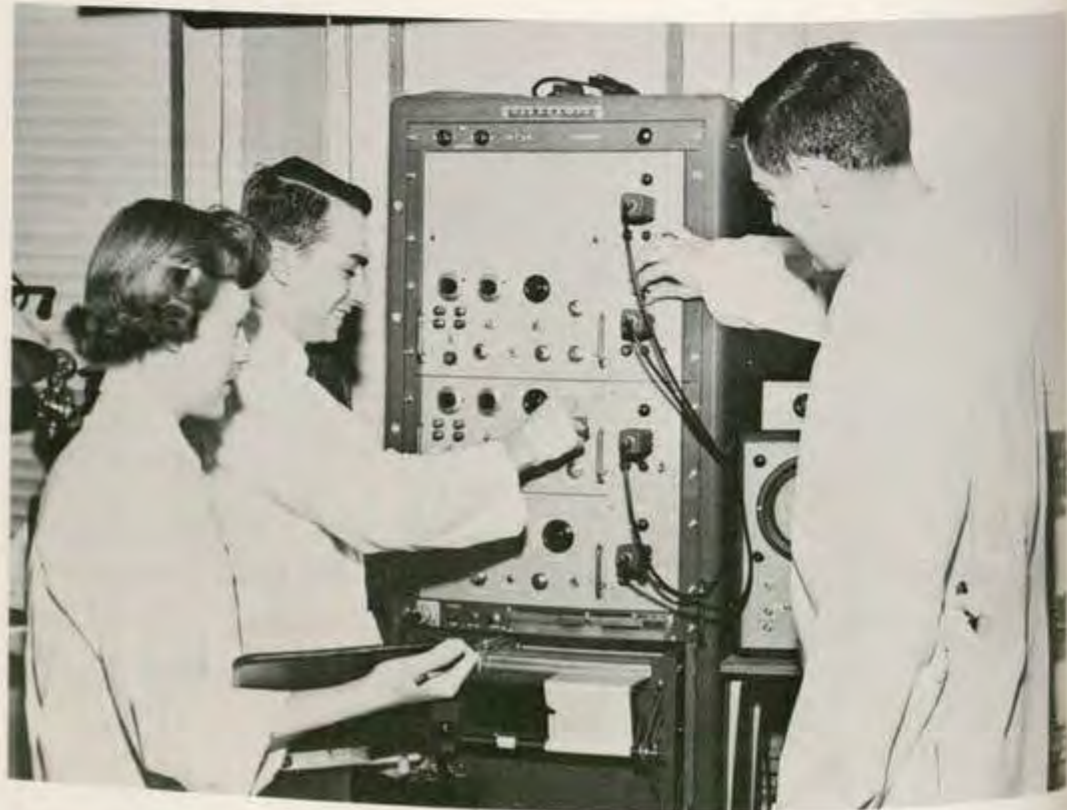
BIOLOGICAL

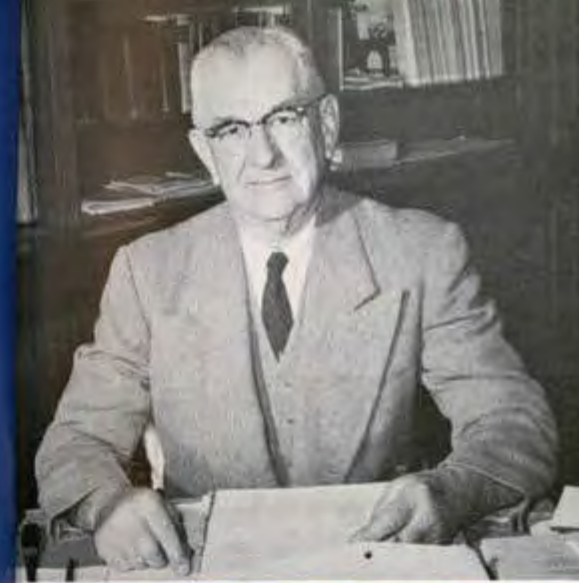
■ The School of Biological Sciences, which was organized in 1928, consists of five Divisions: Division of Anatomy; Division of Chemistry; Division of Pathology and Microbiology; Division of Pharmacology; and Division of Physiology. Students of several professional schools and colleges which comprise the Medical Units receive their basic science instruction in these Divisions.

A limited number of qualified students are admitted to the Graduate School. Graduate study in the School of Biological Sciences may lead to the Master of Science degree and the degree of Doctor of Philosophy. The school, in its conduct of graduate student training, operates as an extension of the College of Liberal Arts of the University and under general direction of the Graduate School.

The Dean and five Chiefs of Divisions of the School of Biological Sciences are members of the Faculty Councils of the several professional colleges and schools.

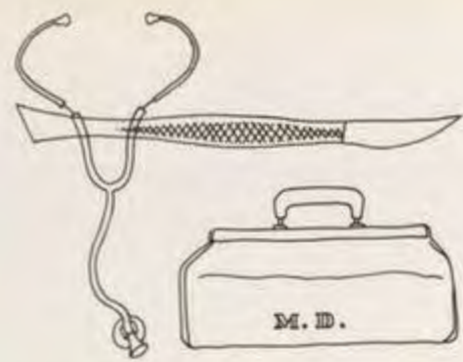

C L A S S E S





The University of Tennessee Medical School is the largest in the United States, presently having an enrollment of 632 students. It has the unique feature of being operated on a quarter system under which a class is graduated four times a year. The school is under the direction of Dr. M. K. Callison.

The first two years of the curriculum comprise the pre-clinical years with instruction in the basic sciences. Following are the third and fourth years, the clinical years, devoted to further instruction plus actual clinical patient experience. The main University teaching hospital is the John Gaston, which has 566 beds. The school is also associated with five other hospitals in the Medical Center supplying further experience to the Junior and Senior students.

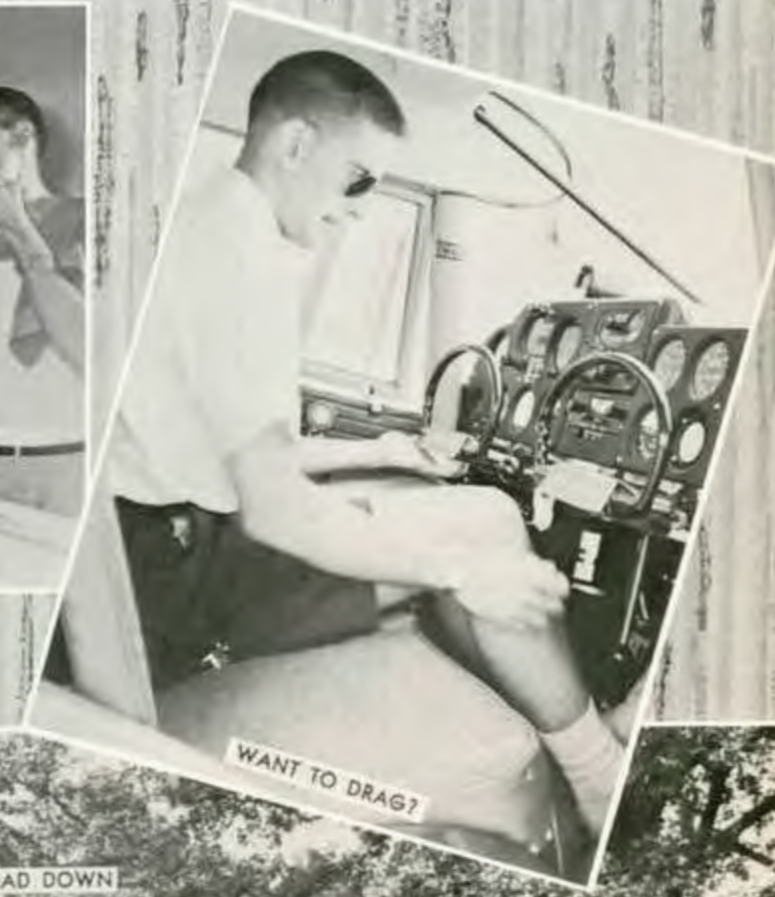

The University of Tennessee College of Dentistry is the oldest dental school in the South and the third oldest now operated in this country. The college is operated on the quarterly basis and is in session all four seasons. There are twelve classes enrolled at all times and each class has approximately thirty members. Based on yearly graduates Tennessee ranks right at the top of a list of the nation's largest dental colleges. Principally, Tennessee draws its students from the home state, however, location in the tri-state area entices large numbers from Arkansas and Mississippi.

The present building, completed in 1949, is adjacent to the other buildings of the University of Tennessee Medical Units. The building is of Collegiate Gothic Architecture, and is five stories high, 192 feet long and 80 feet wide. It is handsomely decorated, and is furnished with the most modern dental equipment, effectively lighted with the latest type of fluorescent fixtures, and provided with adequate artificial ventilation. It houses all clinics and technical laboratories in dentistry.

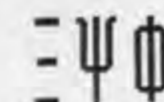

Omicron Kappa Upsilon is a society of dentists whose purpose is as stated in the preamble of the society's first constitution, "To encourage and develop a spirit of emulation among students in dentistry and to recognize in an appropriate manner those who shall distinguish themselves by high grade of scholarship."

The society was organized in 1914 at Northwestern University Dental School. The official insignia adopted in 1915 embodies the spirit of the society. The insignia is a key with the letters, O (Omicron), K (Kappa), and U (Upsilon) by the Greek letter S (Sigma). The first three initials, which indicate the name of this society, are derived from three Greek words, Odonotos (teeth) Kai (and), and Hygia (health). The encircling letter S (Sigma) drives from the Greek word Soteria (conservation or preservation), and represents the all embracing ideal of conservation which is the chief concern of the dental profession and its oral health service.

There are 46 chapters with approximately 9,500 members. Psi Chapter was founded May 15, 1929, and now has a membership of 114. Its charter members were R. S. Vinsant, R. D. Dean, C. P. Harris, J. F. Bigge, W. E. Lundy, L. J. McRae, J. J. Ogden, J. D. Towner, and W. J. Templeton.
