University of Tennessee Health Science Center College of Medicine Scholar's Year Program

The University of Tennessee Health Science Center (UTHSC), College of Medicine encourages its students to expand their knowledge and skills by seeking research or scholarly experiences outside the established curriculum. The Scholar's Year program at the University of Tennessee is available to students who have completed their second or third year of the curriculum and who are interested in completing a year-long experience in research, international medicine, or another pre-approved scholarly project.

- Students will be enrolled in a Special Topics course for five (5) credit hours each semester. Students will be expected to remain in contact with the College of Medicine, providing regular updates on their progress and a formal summary of their experiences upon return to the university. The course will be graded Pass/Fail and will appear on the student's transcript.
- Since the course is not part of the formal medical school curriculum, enrollment in the Special Topics course will not qualify the student to receive financial aid from UTHSC during the Scholar's Year.
- During the Scholar's Year, the student will receive a tuition waiver for the Special Topics course. However, students participating in the Scholar's Year Program will still be required to pay all necessary fees to maintain medical liability insurance, health insurance, and other fees as assessed by the Bursar's Office.
- Application for the Scholar's Year must be approved by the Associate Dean of Student Affairs and the Associate Dean of Medical Education.
- Applicant must be a full-time student in good standing with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.2.
- Those who participate in their third-year must have received a passing score on USMLE Step 1.
- Those who participate in their fourth-year must have completed all of the M3 required clerkships.
- Fourth-year participants must take Step 2 CK and CS prior to beginning the Scholar's Year.
- Fourth-year participants must take an approved patient care intensive rotation immediately upon reentering the curriculum as a way to refresh clinical skills.

Students interested in an international experience must also meet all requirements for international experiences described on the "Travel Policy" website. (http://www.uthsc.edu/Medicine/students/policies/travel.php).

Note: This program does not apply to cases in which a student decides to pursue an additional degree before completing his/her MD degree, i.e. PhD/MD program. Please consult with the Associate Dean for Medical Education in such instances.
