Purpose: The purpose of this mini-fellowship is to increase the ability of primary care clinicians to care for children with developmental delays/disabilities and behavioral issues.

Description: Community physicians will join Developmental Pediatricians for clinical observations and educational sessions related to a variety of developmental disabilities to increase their understanding of diagnosis and management strategies in a primary care setting.

(all participants are required to have certain immunizations and select health checks for presence in clinical settings).
